Regular past simple verbs

Remember that we don't normally pronounce the e in -ed. The -ed ending is usually pronounced /t/ or /d/. The difference between these endings is very small. We only pronounce the d in -ed when there is a t or d before it, eg: wanted, ended. With these verbs -ed is /id/
